

¿Qué será, será? Future Visions and Worries of Adolescents and Young Adults: The Europe 2038 Project

The main goal of the Europe 2038 project which is currently conducted in seven European countries (Albania, Austria, Germany, Italy, Romania, Spain, and UK) is to find out the visions and the worries of young persons aged 16 to 25 years regarding a future Europe – "Europe 2038". The project seeks to answer the following questions:

- What **visions and worries** do young persons of today have for Europe 2038?
- What are their answers for today's major societal challenges like ageing, financial crisis, clean energy, mobility/migration, freedom and security?
- Which **measures** do young citizens suggest to overcome these major challenges?

The **scientific part of the project** is organized in two main parts. First, a qualitative pre-study of young persons living in the seven countries was conducted. Based on these qualitative answers, a quantitative Pan-European survey was constructed. Data collection in seven countries is currently under way. Science communication is an integral part of the project and covers two main activities. Based on the results of the Pan-European survey in the seven countries, a Pan-European Declaration will be formulated. Moreover, multiplier events will be organized in each of the partner countries.

Pan – European Survey

By conducting a large Pan-European survey in seven countries, the project collects the opinions of **several thousands of young persons** aged 16-25. To foster **civic and democratic participation** at Union level, young people are invited to voice their most urgent needs together with their brightest visions for **"Europe 2038"**. The opinions of young men and women from various backgrounds - especially from minority groups - will be gathered.

Pan - European Declaration

After collecting the opinions of youth and of multipliers, the ideas gathered will be translated into the declaration "Europe 2038" and will be presented to EU representatives.

Multiplier Events

Professionals like teachers, social workers or educationalists located in seven European countries will be invited to participate in events with the main goal to empower them to actively combat violence and social exclusion experiences of young people. Professional youth workers who are equipped with knowledge, skills and motivation have a key multiplier role to foster civic participation on Union level among youth.
